We say "I don't want to talk about it" but we need to.

Sin alienates us from God

How does this story impact our relationships with others?

Can we communicate as Adam and Eve did before the fall?

True or False—Before the fall, Adam and Eve did not argue.

It is only through reconciliation that our communication with God can be restored. Communication is a huge part of our lives. Can you imagine what life would be like if you couldn't communicate? Yikes! Communication is also an essential part of leadership. You cannot be a leader if you cannot communicate.

As you can see on the "God in Communication" diagram, communication is pretty messed up because of sin. Let's talk about this...

The essence of sin is pride

Pride was Satan's problem. He sought to lift himself up to be like God. Pride is self-centeredness.

How Pride Hides

I want to be perfect
I know I am not
So...I hide my imperfections
When will I stop hiding? When I am perfect.

I need to realize that it is wrong to think that I have achieved or can achieve perfection in any area in this life, but that it is right to want to become perfect in every area in this life, through God's power and for God's glory.

How Pride Blames

I want others to be perfect I know they are not So...I hurl at their imperfections When will I stop hurling? When they are perfect.

I need to deal with my imperfections and the imperfections of others.

We get so used to keeping to ourselves those thoughts and feelings that would be considered negative that we tend to hide a lot of other things - even those thoughts and feelings that would be considered positive.

THE ANSWER

The answer is **not** to think less and talk more. The answer is to learn to communicate **openly**, **honestly**, and **appropriately** the essence of what I am thinking and feeling – communicating it to God, myself, and others.

The best way to learn how to communicate with others... is to communicate with others!

Others miss out on knowing you because they only see one side of you - the one with no problems.

Gloomy Gloria

Single adult that wants to marry.

Looks in mirror and concludes she is unattractive, much uglier than anyone else Sitting alone, she thinks "I will never be happy."

Many issues we choose to hide refuse to lie dormant;
they roar and roam around and claw at our soul

Irate Ira

Gets mad

He does "militant meditation"

Loses his cool and comes unglued, starting fights and arguments

Many issues we choose to hide can cause us to EXPLODE.

Mac Muller

He thinks a lot, with and to himself

He doesn't share much with others, but keeps everything hidden

Shy

Quiet

Reserved

He replays incidents in his mind

The person who **internalizes** so much tends to wrap a thicker shell around himself and communicates less of real significance to others.
